Arthur E. Apolinario, M.D., M.P.H., F.A.A.F.P. is a Board-Certified Family Physician in rural practice at Clinton Medical Clinic in Clinton, North Carolina in Sampson County and a Fellow of the American Academy of Family Physicians. He is the current President of the North Carolina Medical Society in its 174th year of existence serving the patients and providers of the state.



He trained at Tulane University School of Medicine and Tulane School of Public Health and Tropical Medicine for his MD and MPH in Health Systems Management.

He currently sits on the Board of Trustees of Carolina Complete Health, the only Provider-Led Medicaid Insurance company in the nation and is chair of their Medical Affairs Committee.

He also enhances his practice as a certified hypnotherapist for weight loss, smoking cessation, anxiety and other issues.

He was born in New Jersey to immigrant Filipino parents, and grew up in Philadelphia where his mother was a post-anesthesia registered nurse, and his father was an OB GYN.

He got his BA in English Literature at Gannon University in Erie, PA and concentrated in Shakespearean literature and drama.

He actively teaches medical students, Nurse Practitioners, and physician assistants in training.

Dr. Art is active in the community: he served several terms on the Board of Directors of the U Care Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault Prevention program, including 2 terms as Board President and served the NC Governor's Crime Commission, Council on Domestic Violence.
