Representative Erin Paré

Representative Erin Paré has served in the North Carolina House of Representatives since January 2021. She represents the people of District 37 in Southern Wake County. In January 2025, Paré was re-appointed by her colleagues to continue to serve as Deputy Conference Chair of the NC House Republican Caucus for the 2025-2026 legislative session.



For the 2025-2026 Legislative Session, Paré serves as a Chair of the House Committee on Appropriations, and she serves as a Vice Chair of the House Committee on Appropriations on General Government, and the House Committee on Rules, Calendar, and Operations of the House. Paré also serves on the Committee on Energy and Public Utilities, the Health Committee, the Committee on Homeland Security and Military and Veterans Affairs, the Transportation Committee, and the House Select Committee on Helene Recovery.

Paré was appointed to serve on the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations, the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on General Government, and the Joint Legislative Economic Development and Global Engagement Oversight Committee.

Rep. Paré was elected by her colleagues in the House to serve as Chair of the Wake County Delegation

Representative Paré served as the first Chair of the House Select Committee on Advancing Women in S.T.E.M. In April of 2023, Paré was appointed to the Interstate Commission on Educational Opportunity for Military Children State Council.

Paré is a member of the IDD Caucus and the Life Science Caucus, and the Joint Bipartisan Arts Caucus, and serves as an officer of the bipartisan Legislative Women's Caucus.

Representative Paré and her husband Wayne, a 24-year Army veteran, settled in Holly Springs after 12 years as an active-duty Army family.

Prior to military life, Paré spent seven years as a government affairs professional in Washington, D.C., representing businesses and trade associations on public policy matters and regulatory reform. Paré served as the director of the Regulatory Improvement Council (RIC), a business coalition that advocated for the improved use of transparency, sound science, and cost-benefit analysis in the federal regulatory decision-making process.

Paré grew up in Herndon, Virginia, and graduated with an M.A. in International Commerce and Policy and a B.A. in Government International Politics from George Mason University.
