LyftUp Community Programs

Lyft's mission is to improve people's lives with the world's best transportation.



LyftUp is our comprehensive effort to expand transportation access to those who need it most. We partner with leading nonprofits to help provide free and discounted rides to individuals and families who lack affordable, reliable transportation.

Gain access to healthy food for those who live in areas limited in grocery options Get a ride to job interviews, job training, and the first few weeks of work Participate meaningfully in civic life especially voting Connect with critical resources in the aftermath of natural disasters Use bikeshare systems seamlessly in every neighborhood Invest in local grassroots transportation initiatives

In North Carolina, this has looked like...



workers get where they need to go to provide medical care, deliver food, staff shelters, and perform other essential services.



Jobs Access: Helps provide opportunity to those lacking transportation by giving them access to both jobs and trainings getting them into the workforce.



Grocery Access: Helps connect those with limited grocery options to healthy food sources while also providing driver earning opportunities.Loaves & Fishes

Example Use Cases

- Essential rides to the grocery store, food bank, or pharmacy
- Rides to critical healthcare appointments
- Rides for caregivers to deliver essential goods, such as to the elderly
- Rides to work for essential workers
- Rides to shelters or safety for those facing domestic or intimate partner violence
- Rides for individuals released on bail to get home, or to get to court/ legal appointments
- Rides to voting polls

Public Safety campaigns

- The Governors Highway Safety Association (GHSA) and Lyft have awarded the <u>State Highway Safety Offices</u> in Colorado, Illinois, New Mexico, North Carolina and Texas nearly \$100,000 in grant funds and Lyft ride credits to support campaigns to help prevent impaired driving this holiday season.
- North Carolina Governor's Highway Safety Program (GHSP) will partner with Atrium Health, Charlotte Department of Transportation, Vision Zero Coalition, Charlotte Mecklenburg Police Department, and other local law enforcement agencies to encourage people to use Lyft as an alternative to driving after drinking. The effort is part of GHSP's holiday <u>Booze It and Lose It</u> campaign, which will feature discounted Lyft rides and the distribution of campaign face coverings to restaurants, bars and grocery stores.
